During the course of this past year The Most Honorable Christian Knights of the Rose ® and The Most Honorable Order of Knights of Saint Michael the Archangel~Dagger Sub Rosa ® have contributed greatly to our communities and to charitable causes.

2014 Fraternal Activities

During the calendar year of 2014 our membership contributed more than **80 hours** for visits of individuals in nursing homes, hospitals and caring of the sick. Members made bereaved (visits of condolence) in the

amount of **100 hours**. Members have traveled over **8,000 miles** to provide volunteer services and support. Members **volunteered** services to churches in excess of **1500 hours**, more than **1100 hours** to community related activities, and over **900 hours** to other community related enhancement events.

Our membership **donated** in excess of \$30,000 to charitable and benevolent causes.

Fraternal hours within the Order was in excess of 400 hours.

And finally, over the course of the past year our membership has **volunteered** more than **300 hours** of fraternal service to sick and disabled members families.


what the future holds for us!




Through the generosity of Gloria Clinton, on an annual bagraduates from various academies.


